Increase Inria's impact at the international level (including Europe)

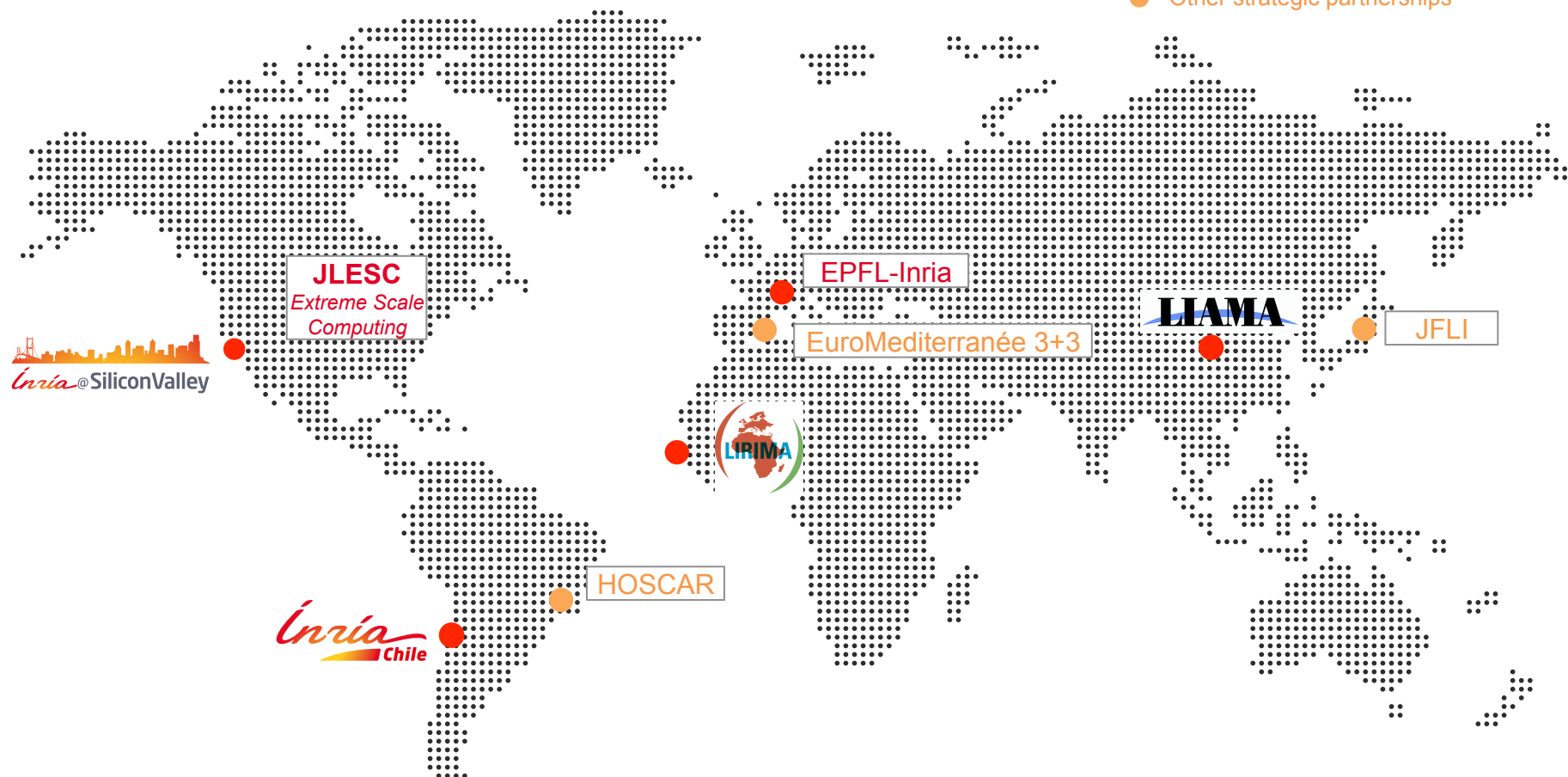
- By setting up strategic partnerships in countries within which we have a critical mass of research collaborations: Inria International Labs

- By helping to choose the best partners and funding opportunities (including Horizon 2020)

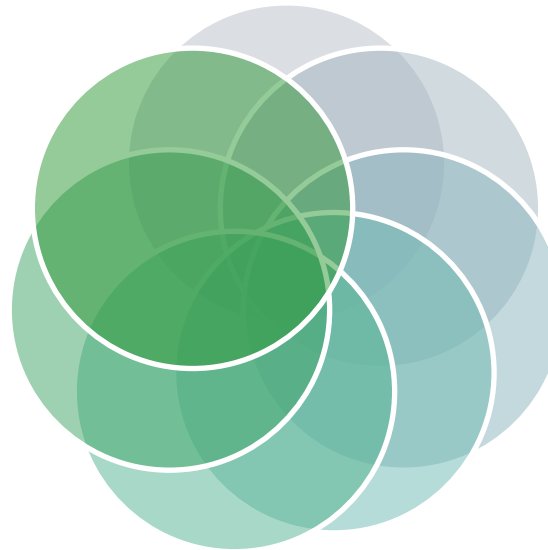

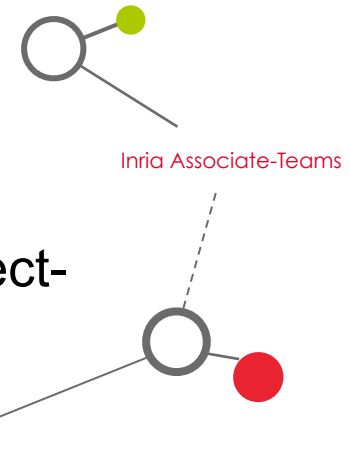

International Joint Research at Inria: The « Associate Teams » Program



- Annual call for joint research projects between an Inria project-team and a research team abroad
- Supports scientific activities for 3 years, renewable once
- € 30.000 to 50.000 max. funding per project (for the 3 years)
- Joint calls (with co-funding) with Brazil, India, Japan and Taiwan

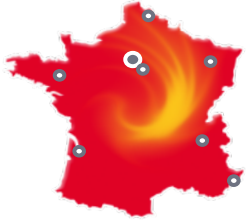

Encourages long stays of eminent international researchers in Inria Project Teams

Duration of the chair: 12 months over a 5 year period

Sabbatical

Supporting Inria's experienced scientists for a long research stay in a lab abroad

Funding for a 6 to 12 month stay in a research center abroad

Explorer

Supporting junior Inria scientist for a research stay in a lab abroad to launch new collaborations

Funding for a 1 to 3 month stay in a research center abroad



European Mobility programs:

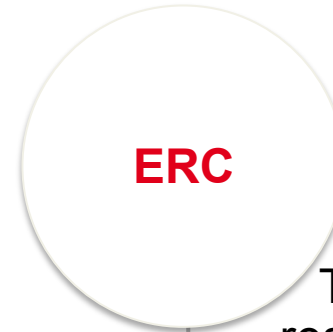


To support researcher mobility:

Funding from 2 to 3 years



European Research Council

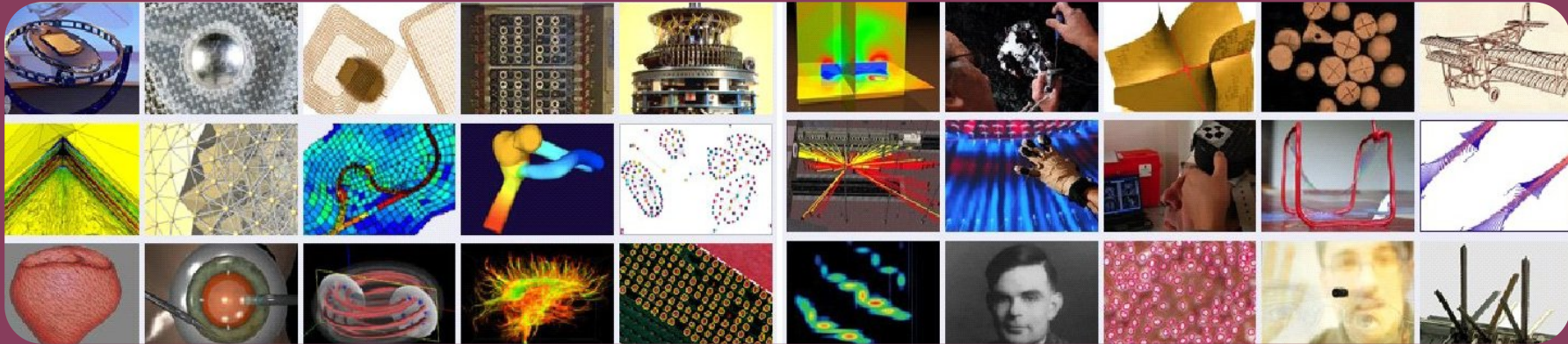


To attract excellent researchers in Europe: Starting, Consolidator & Advanced Grants
