This year new Grids (Grid5000, EGEE, NorduGRID,...) will be added with new Grid Middleware (ObjectWeb/ProActive, gLITE,...). Shall we know how many solutions exist for 25 Queens on a 25x25 Chess Board? Again Teams from every Places in the World (Europe, Asia, North America, Latin America) will compete In real time to:

- First: Calculate the highest number of solutions, proving the best interoperability, deployment and efficiency of Grids.
- **Second:** Deploy the highest number of nodes in all Grids.
- Third: Compute the results at best speed (optimization, efficiency).
